Minutes of Meeting

Lisa read the minutes of the April 2, 2018 meeting. Tom made a motion to accept the minutes with the correction of the spelling of Numidia; Bob Baylor seconded the motion.

Public Comment

Jim Orzolek stated that the speed limit sign by the telephone pole by his house needs some bolts in it. Bobby stated he will have the guys take a look at it.

Mr. Orzolek also stated that in the first version of the new zoning ordinance and some versions after there was a definition for religious quarters; however, in the new version

it has disappeared as far as he can tell. Mr. Orzolek feels that something should be put in to some level since it is not impossible to have a religious quarter come in to the township. Larry Frace stated that it was taken out and he remembers some discussion that they did not want to regulate such business, but he would have to look back through his notes. Bobby stated that another work session will be held later this month and they can discuss it then.

Mr. Orzolek also asked the supervisors again to consider adopting a noise ordinance that was discussed at last month's meeting.

Mr. Bodman stated that the township should consider putting another sign on the township building since you cannot see the current one coming down the road. Bobby will look into it.

Mr. Bodman also asked again about the parking ordinance in effect signs since he feels they do not tell anyone anything. Bobby stated that the signs are posted at every entrance of the township and if anyone would have questions they would contact the office and could request a copy, but the ordinance was mainly put in due to the parking issues specifically in Wonderview.

Mr. Bodman also asked if the most current version of the zoning ordinance is posted on the township's webpage and Lisa stated it should have been posted today.

Mr. Bodman also asked for an update on the camping sites on the river. Larry Frace stated he has the update on his zoning report that he filed a floodplain management violation on Chris Ehmer (owner) with the district magistrate on April 23, 2018.

Old Business

Zoning Ordinance/Map Changes

Bobby stated that they are working on confirming dates with for another work session to be held in May which will be advertised.

Basement Wall

Bobby stated that Keyser Construction removed the wall in the basement and they are working on cleaning it out.

Bridge Repairs

The township as notified by Larson Design Group that the deck replacement project for Bridge No. 41 by the store is scheduled to start on 5/21/18. The road will be closed to traffic until the new deck is completed and the detour will take traffic across Fisher Run Road bridge up onto the railroad bed (Bridge Road).

New Business

Workers' Compensation Renewal

Lisa stated that the township's workers' compensation policy renewed with Selective insurance for \$6,872.00 which only increased \$273 from the expiring policy.

Auditor's Report

Lisa read the 2017 Audit Report for Main Township:

Secretary/Treasurer – All records filed monthly and were in excellent order

Zoning – All permits were in good order

Police – Jack Pollard worked with the auditors on the citations and will follow-up on a few of them

Tax Collector – Tax books were audited and they had some issues with the check register book, which were answered by the tax collector. There is a substantial amount @ \$2,000 in the banks favor related to a refund check that was not cashed. The auditors did not sign off on the tax audit due to the discrepancy and asked that the tax collector add notes when refunding checks and provide a new register each year.
